CLR Classroom Management Workshop

In order to have a positive classroom management system, teachers have to separate out cultural behaviors from disruptive behaviors. In many cases, the two are confused due to biases, mis-perceptions, and miscommunications. This workshop works participants through a process of reflecting upon their unconscious biases, learning about cultural behaviors according to research, and practicing management strategies for building on the cultural behaviors.

CLR Academic Vocabulary Workshop

Aligning CLR with PBIS Workshop: Enhancing Your PBIS with Validation and Affirmation

Though schools implementing PBIS have demonstrated improvement in creating positive and welcoming school environments, as well as reducing the usage of office disciplinary referrals (ODRs), suspensions, and expulsions, this achievement has not been equitably distributed amongst different ethnic and racial groups. For example, despite the implementation of PBIS with fidelity, Black students are still overrepresented in exclusionary discipline at three times the rate of White students. To mitigate this racial disparity and, most importantly, transform school environments so that they are truly positive and welcoming to ALL students, PBIS must be aligned with CLR. This workshop will examine how PBIS is not inherently CLR but share how it could be made CLR.

Facilitated by a member of the CLR Professional Learning Team, this four-session virtual book study of 90 minutes each supports educators through interactive engagement with and about the text in their understanding of the nuance of the work, developing a common language, considering practical applications and dispelling common misconceptions, all while building a community among the participants. This is an ideal bridge between the professional learning and the teacher coaching series.

For workshops where the support staff in attendance are non-instructional, the workshop focuses on understanding and reactive to the common cultural behaviors of underserved students in a CLR manner.

Asynchronous Binder Study (included with CLR Instructional Support and Development Cycle)

As a mandatory part of the instructional support and development cycle, CCRTL provides an asynchronous binder study of five, 1-hour sessions. The whole teaching staff can participate, but the teachers being taught must participate.

The first session should take place at your convenience before the instructional support begins, one session should take place in between each round of the instructional support sessions, and one after all sessions are finished. The intention of the binder study is to allow participants to work in community to strengthen their mindset and skill-set in the areas of Culturally and Linguistically Responsive Engagement, Vocabulary, Literacy, and Language during the development cycle process.

CLR Leader's Mentoring

Culturally Responsive Leader's Mentoring

In his book "Nuanced," renowned expert on school leadership, Michael Fullan, says that effective, successful leadership is rooted in nuanced leadership, which is recognizing subtle differences in or shades of meaning. It is seeing below the surface, grasping hidden patterns, and finding new pathways to alter and shape better outcomes. Successful CLR leadership requires the skills of nuance, depth, and discernment. By working one-on-one with school/district leadership, the CLR Leadership Mentoring approach will teach how to use the skills of nuance, depth, and discernment in order to support:

- 1. The continued knowledge building around the core principles of CLR.
- 2. The ability to reflect and to be aware of ongoing cultural and linguistic biases.
- 3. The embodiment of the research-based prescriptions for becoming a culturally responsive school/district leader.
- 4. The development of the CLR tenets and the infusion into the school site plan.

We best lead CLR by example. There is no better example of leading than a model CLR classroom that embodies and exemplifies the practices of a CLR educator. CLR is grassroots and a bottom to top leadership model by nature. Teachers are the best leaders of CLR because they can model the instructional approach and, as models, peer coach their colleagues into becoming CLR. The CLR model educator will have the mindset and skillset necessary to lead by example.

Become a CLR Model Educator requires the following:

- 1. Complete the CLR Professional Learning Experience (2 year commitment)
 - a. Jumpstart and/or Advanced Jumpstart Workshop (3 hours each)
 - b. CLR Model Educator Overview Meeting (1 hour)
 - c. CLR Blue Book Study (formerly CLR Binder Study) (5 1 hour session spread across time, virtual and asynchronous)
 - d. CLR Cultural Behavioral Tutorials (16 30 minute sessions spread over two years, virtual and asynchronous)
 - e. Participate in Instructional Support and Development (ISD)
- 2. Become an instructional model of the CLR approach and a mindset model with a positive attitude about students and staff
- 3. Allow classroom practices to be observed by others and serve as a support to other educators
